A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Frank Sakuma called the July 17, 2023, Regular Board Meeting of the Capron Trail Community Development District (the "District") to order at 1:31 p.m. at the offices of Premier Citrus, 14885 Indrio Road, Fort Pierce, Florida 34945.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION
