A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Frank Sakuma called the August 21, 2023, Regular Board Meeting of the Capron Trail Community Development District (the "District") to order at 1:33 p.m. at the offices of Premier Citrus, 14885 Indrio Road, Fort Pierce, Florida 34945.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Mr. Sakuma presented proof that notice of the Regular Board Meeting was published in the *St. Lucie News Tribune* on October 7, 2022, as required by law.

C. ESTABLISH QUORUM

Mr. Sakuma stated that the attendance of Supervisors Tom Jerkins, David Bass and Mike Cofer constituted a quorum and it was in order for the meeting to proceed.

Re: Indrio Land Holdings, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, grant of Deed of Conservation Easement (the "Conservation Easement") to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection on 141.44 acres located in St. Lucie County, Florida, as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto (the "CE Lands"), which acreage lies within and is currently subject to the authority of the Capron Trail Community Development District (hereinafter "CTCDD") pursuant to Chapter 190, F.S.

To Whom it may Concern:

CTCDD has been made aware that Indrio Land Holdings, LLC, intends to grant a Conservation Easement to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection on certain lands that lie within the boundaries of the CTCDD and has requested the CTCDD provide certain assurances to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

This letter is to advise the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection that the CTCDD currently does not have any existing infrastructure improvements, nor does it currently have any plans or intends to construct or place any infrastructure improvements within the CE Lands.

The CTCDD has no objection to Indrio Land Holdings, LLC, granting the Conservation Easement to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection for the purpose of retaining land or water areas in their existing, natural, vegetative, hydrologic, scenic, open, or wooded condition and to retain such areas as suitable habitat for fish, plants, or wildlife in accordance with Section 704.06, F.S., and the CTCDD current operational infrastructure or proposed infrastructure within the surrounding acreage should not interfere with the Conservation Easement and its intended uses during the term of the Conservation Easement.

Further, during the term of the Conservation Easement, the CTCDD will not impose any assessments specific to the CE Lands that would be the responsibility of the State of Florida and will look only to Indrio Land Holdings, LLC, and its successors and/or assigns for payment of any annual assessments due the CTCDD, if any, as it relates to the CE Lands.
